- Self-health monitoring, prevention information and stay home if ill reminders sent to all persons at the facility.
- A short-term closure of facility may be necessary.

Dear Parents and Staff:

As a precautionary measure, a special education classroom at Weber Elementary has been closed and the six students and staff members in this class have been moved to School-to-Home (online) instruction for 14 days due to a student testing positive for COVID-19.

While the students were always socially distanced and there was frequent cleaning of high touch areas, the one positive case reaches the 10% occupancy threshold to close a classroom as indicated by the CCISD COVID-19 Standard Response Protocol. The classroom affected has been closed, cleaned, and tonight it will undergo a thorough disinfection and deep cleaning of non-porous surfaces by a special pandemic cleaning team.

As we navigate through learning in a COVID-19 era, we will always err on the side of caution which is why we are taking this preventative step.

Weber Elementary will be open on Monday. We will continue to do our part to mitigate and prevent the spread of illnesses in our school building by wearing face coverings, socially distancing when possible, and practicing good hygiene.
